Attendance



From September to the end of Term 2 – attendance is 94.5%. This has dipped from 95% in T1. The main reasons for absence are: illness (3.9%) and unauthorised absence (1.6%).

We are aiming to meet the national target of 96% at least this year, although we strive for 100%. Thank you to all of those parents/carers who are always promoting positive attendance.

Pantomime

The Pantomime was absolutely amazing! The teaching staff were in awe of the children's faces, comments and excitement as they watched the show.

It was a magical experience and many children commented on the actors, actresses, costumes, music, lighting and theatre setting. The pupils in Y1-Y6 also showed no fear as they sat in the balcony, on high, watching everything below.
