

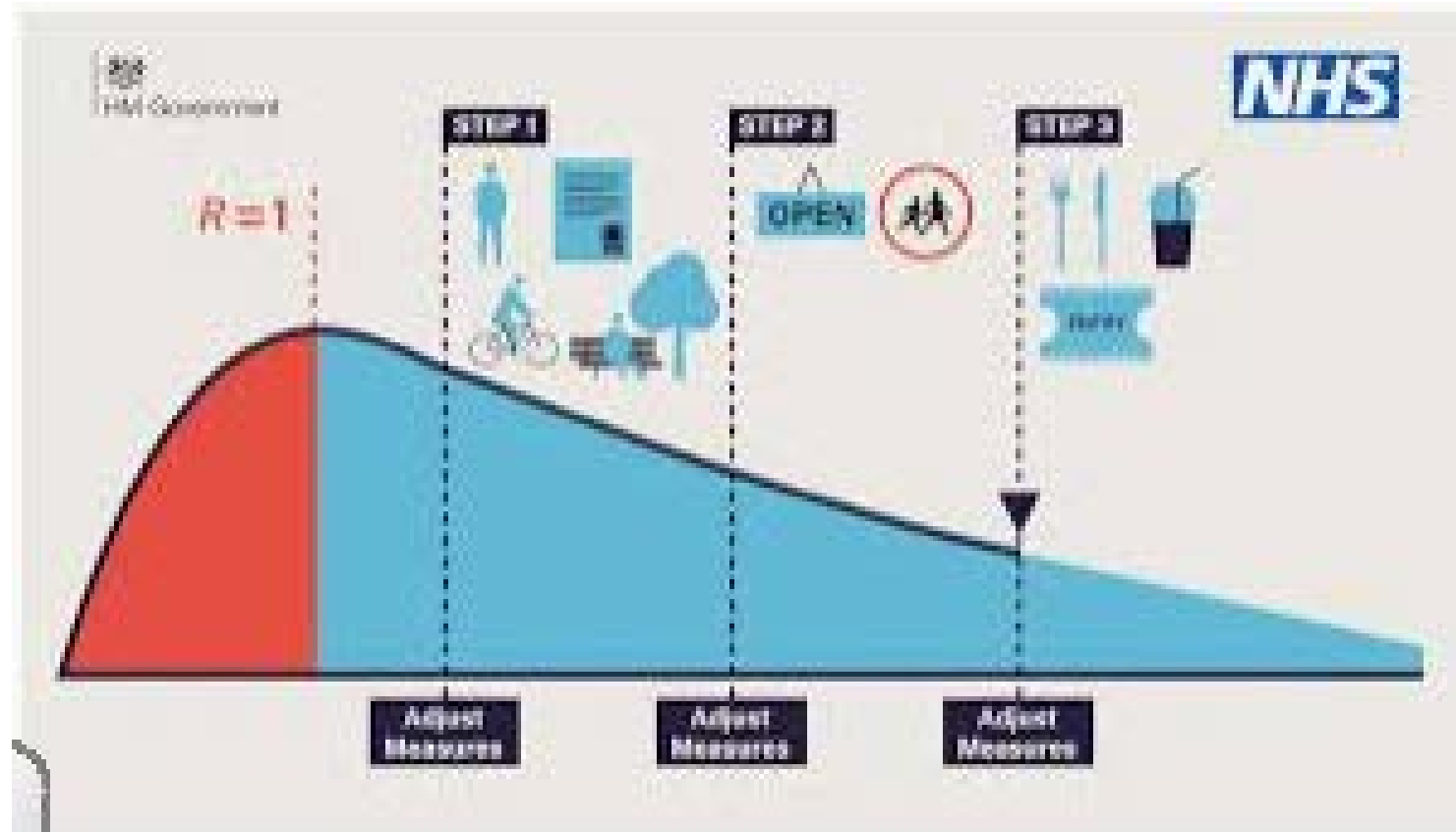
Welcome back to school

Why have we come back to school?

- To begin the road map the government set to bring us all out of lockdown. (see slide 3 illustration).
- The Government have said that children learn better in school and with their year group teacher.
- Three year groups were chosen to come back to school- Reception, Year 1 and Year 6. Year 6 were chosen because *'Those in Year 6 had an abrupt end to their primary school careers, and it will be beneficial for them emotionally to return to school and see their friends before heading off to secondary school in September. Primary teachers will also be able to do vital work preparing them for the move to secondary school.'*

Road map out of Lockdown.

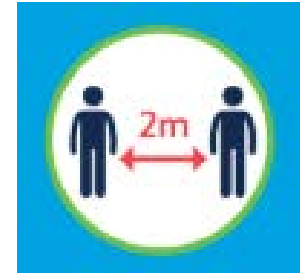


What will school look like?

You may have noticed that school looks different to what it looked like before and that some routines we had before are different or changed.



Why does it look different?



Normally school is a busy place with many adults and children working together. Coronavirus is spread from one human to another through coughing, sneezing and having close contact or touching things that has the virus on it.

So in order to make school a safe place to return to, this had to be addressed by Government, Local Authority, Headteachers and all school staff. We need to keep a safe distance from each other and be able to clean school regularly and thoroughly to stop the spread of the virus.



What to expect in school.

- A part-time timetable - Year 6 are in school on a Monday and Tuesday.
- Staggered start times and home times for classes - Year 6 start at 9.15am and finish at 2pm.
- We will be in bubble groups and only work and socialise within that group. Each bubble group has a lead teacher, who remains with that bubble group. Including taking our breaks and lunch within this group. One bubble group will have 7 children and another bubble group will have 8 children. Some year 6 children are in the Keyworker bubble group.
- Each child will have their own pencil case with equipment inside - not to be shared.
- Clear entrance and exit signs in and out of school as well as one way systems in place in corridors.
- Only 1 person allowed to the toilet or to the sink area in class at a time supervised by their lead teacher.
- A timetable of learning to prepare Year 6 for transition to their secondary school as well as PE, Maths, English, Theme, Science and PSHE.
- An environment to support, reassure and help Year 6 with their own health and well-being around the Corona virus and its personal impact.
