Uniform

Acting upon advice from the Local Authority's SHE team, ventilation is key in lowering the risk of spreading Covid-19. Please can we ask that pupils wear an extra layer, under their school uniform, as more recently the weather has changed, with lowering temperatures. The heating will be on but the classroom doors and windows will also be open. Thermal underwear, a vest or t-shirt under uniform will help, as sometimes wearing coats inside during work time, can constrict the children's movement. Girls can wear tights with skirts or trousers (black or grey) if needed. Please make sure that your child has a coat in school, every-day. We don't want children to potentially catch any colds but at the same time we need to ventilate.

Property Care



We are having some essential building work take place in school, this term. This is being led by the Local Authority and is all subject to risk assessments. The Governing Board are fully aware of the necessary works and have approved them as part of our school improvement. The health and safety of our pupils and staff is always our top priority.

The contractors will be subject to safeguarding checks and Covid-19 risk assessments. We are fortunate that we can separate out the building work from the main school learning evironment, so contractors will not be in classroom areas or the playground.

Charity – Fund Raising

This year, we won't be asking for money to be brought into school. Last year, we had some feedback that some parents/careers were finding it costly to give to each of our causes, especially those with larger families. We were extremely grateful of the fund-raising actioned by the "Friends of Hester's Way" parent/carer group and look forward to this taking place again in the future, when it is safe to do so. COVID-19 Symptoms

Cases are rising in Gloucestershire and many schools are having to partially or fully close to self-isolate due to positive test results. Please remain vigilant and aware.

Individuals will need a test if they have any of the following:

- a high temperature, hot to the touch on chest or back no need to measure temperature
- a new, continuous cough
- a loss, or change in sense of smell or taste

Please also be aware that in children skin rashes and "Covid toe" has been linked to child symptoms of Covid-19, as well as sickness and diarrhoea. Please let us know if your child has these symptoms.

Getting a Test and Self-Isolating

If your child or any member of the household is showing any symptoms call 119 or visit the 119 websites to book to attend a GCC mobile testing site or get a home testing kit. Please self-isolate the household until the test results are negative or for 14 days.
