

Animals Including Humans — Year 1

Objectives

We are learning to:

- Identify and name a variety of common animals including fish, amphibians, reptiles, birds and mammals.
- Identify and name a variety of common animals that are carnivores, herbivores and omnivores.
- Describe and compare the structure of a variety of common animals
- Identify, name, draw and label the basic parts of the human body and say which part of the body is associated with each sense.

Animals

Dog - Carnivore.

Has: 4 legs, fur, claws, and does not lay eggs.



Robin - Omnivore.

Has: 2 legs, feathers, beak and lays eggs.



Frog - Carnivore.

Has: 4 legs, slimy skin and lays eggs.



Sheep - Herbivore.

Has: 4 legs, hair and does not lay eggs.



Goldfish - Herbivore.

Has: no legs, scales, fins and lays eggs.



Snake - Carnivore.

Has: no legs, scales, breathes air, lays eggs.



Key Vocabulary

senses	The physical abilities of sight, smell, hearing, touch
carnivore	An animal which only eats meat from other animals.
herbivore	An animal which only eats plants.
omnivore	An animal which eats both plants and other animals.
body parts	Parts of the body which do particular jobs.

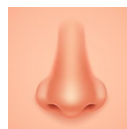

Sight

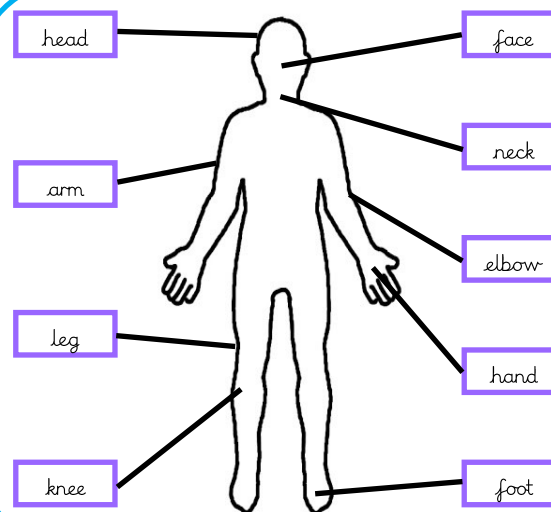


Taste
