

Home Reading Books


Children who are just beginning to learn to read bring home phonically decodable books from our Sounds Write phonics scheme. These books start with the first sounds that a child learns in school which contain only sounds

that have already been taught. Children who have become more confident will then move on to other reading books from the class selection.

Why is sharing books so important?

When children start learning to read, the number of words they can decode accurately is too limited to broaden their vocabulary. This means that it is important for their language development that they have books read to them as often as possible. We want to help with this by providing sharing books that children in Reception and Years 1-3 can choose and bring home alongside their decodable reading book.
