Attendance

Children who have 90% and below attendance are deemed to be persistent absentee pupils. We will be sending out warning letters so that you know your child's attendance needs to improve.

Behaviour Reward - Into Film Festival

Every week the children fill up our whole school marble jar. Each class can earn up to 10 marbles. They count in different ways, including different languages. The children reached a line and as a whole school behaviour reward, they attended the cinema. Reception and Year 1 watched Zog and another short film, whilst Year 2- Year 6 watched Sonic 2. The cinema ensured that these sessions were autism friendly, so that the children were comfortable e.g. lights not totally dimmed, volume reduced and no trailers. Thank you to Cineworld who gave us free tickets. School paid for the coaches, to enable the reward to happen.
